The fundamental principle behind patient/resident rights is that each patient/resident is a member of a family and of society as a whole. These rights are protected by federal and state regulations.	3

Students will learn the correct procedure for measuring temperature, pulse, respirations, and blood pressure. They will learn to recognize and report normal and abnormal findings	3
Day 11 Death and Dying.	Mod. 16	Introduces the student to the various stages of the grieving process and physical signs of approaching death. This unit introduces death as a normal stage of life. The health care provider must recognize the physical, psychological, and spiritual needs of the patient/resident during this period to understand coping mechanisms and provide support to the patient/resident and family members.	2
